The school is changing its policy in respect of toilet passes. Last year a significant number of students were abusing the use of these passes which was causing disruption to lessons. Therefore, if your child needs a toilet pass, please can you provide medical evidence such as appointment letters. Teachers will continue to use their discretion to let a student go to the toilet during lesson time.

#### GCSE results

Over the summer holidays, Year 11 students received their GCSE results. There were some exceptional results for students and many will have already started new courses at college, we wish them all the best.

The proportion of students achieving a grade 4+ in English and Maths was 76% and grade 5+ in English and Maths was 51%. Both of these results were the highest of all schools in Scunthorpe, a fantastic achievement.

Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> October is open evening, this is an opportunity for parents of children who are in Year 6 to visit the school. If you know of any parent with a child in year 6 please pass on this information. The evening runs between 3:30pm and 6:45pm.
