Christmas Dinner

The school will be serving Christmas Dinner on Wednesday 14th December. Please see below on how you can order this for your child

Students who pay for lunch -

In order to prepare for this we have created an item in ParentPay for you to purchase Christmas Dinner for your child, there are two options meat or vegetarian which you will need to add into the notes when you purchase this, the cost is £2.40. If you child wishes to have Christmas Dinner please can you pay for it using the item in ParentPay called 'Christmas Dinner' we are unable to take money from their existing school dinner account in Parentpay. As we need to order the correct amount of food please can you order this by Wednesday 30th November, orders after this time unfortunately cannot be accepted. If your child does not wish to have a Christmas Dinner please can they bring a packed lunch into school as no other food will be served in the canteen on this day, however, they can still join in the Christmas celebrations and sit in the dining hall will all other students.

Free School Meal Students -

As a free lunch is provided you are not required to pay for this, however, we still require you to log into ParentPay if your child wishes to have this and select either the meat or vegetarian option, so we are aware of numbers etc. If your child does not wish to have a Christmas Dinner the school will prepare a packed lunch for your child, please can you access ParentPay and indicate whether your child would like a Meat Christmas Dinner, Vegetarian Christmas Dinner or packed lunch.

Service Pupil Premium

The Department for Education (DfE) introduced the Service pupil premium (SPP) in April 2011 in recognition of the specific challenges children from service families face and as part of the commitment to delivering the armed forces covenant.

It is designed to assist the school in providing the additional support that these children may need. Pupils attract SPP if they meet one of the following criteria:

- One of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces (including pupils with a parent who is on full commitment as part of the full time reserve service)
- One of their parents died whilst serving in the armed forces and the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme

Safeguarding

As you will know, online safety is paramount to the safeguarding and wellbeing of young people. Students spend more time than ever online and we all have a part to play in keeping young people safe. In the first year of the pandemic, the NSPCC helpline saw a 45% increase in contacts from people worried about online sexual abuse. Together we can make sure it's safe for every child to go online. The NSPCC supports parents with online safety advice, and to protect and support young people. Can we also remind parents that no students are to leave school either for appointments or ill without an appropriate adult collecting them from reception.

Year 11 mock exams and preparations

The exam season starts on Monday 21st November and runs for three weeks. It is vital that their attendance is 100% during the season as we cannot guarantee that any missed exams will be facilitated during the school day. The results of their mock exams will be released the week of the 9th January. Students will also receive predicted grades for the end of year 11 which can be used on college and apprenticeship applications.

Students must be on time and present for every exam, we will not make exceptions for students who are not punctual. Students must come fully equipped for every exam, this includes a clear pencil case, black pens, pencils, rulers, highlighters, erasers and a scientific calculator. Students are allowed to bring in a clear, transparent sports bottle filled with water only and they must not bring in any mobile phones, watches, air pods or revision notes.

All students have been given a mock exam and revision booklet. This provides them with an additional copy of the mock exam timetable, the exam regulations as well as a wealth of material on how to revise and different revision techniques. This booklet is also available on the school website [Parent information – Exams].

The school offers opportunities for students to study independently, both within and outside of school hours. Please do encourage your child to make use of these facilities.

- The library is open to students at both break and lunch times.
- In library is open every day before school (8:15-8:40) and after school (3:05-3:45).
- RE4 is manned by Mr Waite and Miss Karlsberg on a Monday and Friday 3:05-4:00 so students can revise independently or ask for support in revision skills.
