The Aegir school is a specialist academy for students who have a range of learning difficulties including moderate, general and severe learning difficulties, autism and Asperger's syndrome. As such, our year 10 students prepared a day that focused on friendship and created activities so all young people could feel connected through dancing, boxing, reading, craft sessions and more. We can't speak highly enough of every year 10 student and how they conducted themselves throughout the visit. They were incredibly mature, kind and respectful of our guests and it speaks volumes of the character of our students. It was an absolute privilege to invite the Aegir school in and witness such profound acts of love from our students. We are very proud of each and every one of you.

Attendance:

We continue to encourage good attendance from our pupils and the aim is above 95% attendance. It is crucial that students attend regularly and on time, unless the reason for absence is unavoidable, so that students have the best possible chance of success at school. If your child is absent from school, please contact the school by telephone only to explain the absence. The school office will ask for an explanation of the absence and will engage in dialogue to ascertain if the absence can be avoided. The Heads of Year work closely with the Attendance Officer to identify patterns of absence and those who fall below the threshold may be subject to an attendance plan and invited into school for a meeting.

On Friday 16th December the school community will come together to celebrate Advent by having a whole school mass. School on this day will close at 12:25pm, buses have been arranged to pick students up at this time.
