

COVID Vaccinations

Over the half term week The Ironstone Centre, West Street Scunthorpe have dedicated 12-15 year covid vaccination sessions on Wednesdays and Saturdays 2.30-7.30pm. **Appointments can be booked via the National Booking System or by calling 119.**

Walk in appointments are possible but only if there is availability. Currently appointment availability stands at 50% still available for this Saturday 12/2, 70% available for Wednesday 16/2 and 95% available for Saturday 19/2.

If a child has been Covid positive the they will be able to have the vaccine if they are within 12 weeks of a positive Covid test.

Year 8 RE Curriculum

During the next half term, year 8 pupils in RE will be looking at themes that are covered by Relationships and Sex Education-RSE. This component focuses the relationship element, specifically attitudes towards marriage, divorce, family life and homosexuality in the UK and how these have changed over time. This will also include explorations of Christian and Muslim attitudes to the above. Whilst promoting Catholic values and virtues and teaching in accordance with Church teaching, we are committed to ensure that pupils are offered a balanced programme by providing an RSE programme that offers a range of viewpoints on issues. Knowing about facts and enabling young people to explore differing viewpoints is not the same as promoting behaviour and is compatible with our school's promotion of Catholic teaching. We will ensure that pupils have access to the learning they need to stay safe, healthy and understand their rights as individuals. Parents do have the right to request that their child be withdrawn from some or all of sex education delivered as part of statutory RSE; the next half-term topic covers the relationships element of RSE. Please see below an outline of the lesson-by-lesson topics and if you wish to discuss any of the elements further, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

- 1. Students to describe how attitudes to marriage, divorce, family life and homosexuality in the UK have changed
- 2. Students to explore Christian and Muslim attitudes to sex outside marriage
- 3. Students to examine the purposes of marriage in Catholic Christianity and Islam
- 4. Students to explore Christian and Muslim attitudes to divorce

- 5. Students to explore why family life is important to Catholics and Muslims
- 6. Students to know and understand how Catholic parishes help with the upbringing of children
- 7. Students to explain how Catholic parishes help to keep families together
- 8. Students to explore Christian and Muslim attitudes to homosexuality
- 9. Students to look at different methods of contraception
- 10. Students to examine different Christian and Muslim attitudes to contraception
- 11. Students to explore Christian and Muslim attitudes towards equality of men and women.
- 12. Students to explore how an issue from marriage and the family has been presented on one form of the media
