

We now have in operation a drinks sustainability station in the school canteen where students can purchase a variety of flavoured juices. When purchased students will be given a token to put into the machine and it will allow them to fill up their drinks bottle.

Drinks can still be purchased in cartons etc but we will be gradually phasing these out, therefore, please can students be encouraged to bring a refillable drinks bottle to school so they can use the drinks station to avoid purchasing drinks in plastic bottles/cartons.
