Encouraging Reading at Home

How Could You Introduce Reading Aloud In Your Home?

- Approach it through a 'normal' event. During a journey in the car, you could mention you've been reading something and would like their opinion on it. Later on, read the text to them and discuss their thoughts.
- Short articles about current events are a great way to start with older children who may have gone a long time without being read to at home.
- A car journey is also a great opportunity to listen to audio books. This benefits families with busy schedules and parents who don't feel confident reading themselves.
- Suggest reading a novel aloud (or listening to an audiobook) as a family - they could do another activity at the same time like drawing or doing the washing up.
