# Safeguarding

During last year, the academy worked closely with The Diana Award and the Anti-Bullying Alliance to revise procedures around bullying behaviour.

So far, we have had a number of Y7, Y8, Y9 and Y10 students participate in The Diana Award Anti-Bullying Ambassador training. We are hoping to roll this out to the new Y7 students this year.

All staff have participated in Anti-Bullying training and this has been cascaded to all students within the academy so that we are all aware of what bullying behaviours are, the roles that students adopt in such situations (online and offline) and so that we are all using a common language regarding bullying behaviour situations. Further education around bullying behaviours is being delivered via our Acts of Worship programme to reflect our Catholic virtues.

As part of our revised procedures, students who have exhibited bullying behaviours will receive a C4 or C5, depending upon the investigation within the academy. Alongside this, students will take part in an 'education and awareness' package in order to reflect on their actions, educate them about the impact of their actions and to promote positive change so that the culture in the academy is as we all desire.

It is vital that all stakeholders recognise that bullying behaviours are a choice that can be changed, which is why we call it 'bullying behaviour' rather than label students as 'bullies'. As a Catholic academy, the values of reflection, forgiveness and hope are key to helping students live out their mission to 'love, respect and serve one another as disciples of Jesus Christ' because all students have the opportunity to change and to reflect on their actions. Alongside the work around Catholic virtues, we are reflecting on virtuous behaviours that we can all exhibit in our daily lives to show humility, compassion, tolerance and love to one another.

Students have helped to design signage which is displayed around the academy, which promotes the Catholic Ethos, values, virtues and positive behaviours associated with the Catholic life of the academy. There are also clear signs about how student can report concerns and bullying behaviours.

On the academy website you will find information regarding the academy's terminology when investigating bullying behaviours. There is also further information regarding reporting systems and support mechanisms within the academy. It is vital to note that where an incident is not defined as bullying behaviour, it will still be dealt with using the consequence system or any other sanction and support deemed necessary. Bullying behaviour is defined as 'repeated, negative and intentional' as support by The Diana Award.

We are advocates of an 'upstander' culture in which students act as upstanders to reduce the potential for bullying behaviours.

#### Alumni Database

We are keen to keep building our alumni database to support our ongoing careers work in school. Each year our ex-students help us in a number of ways including; presenting at assemblies, delivering workshops, supporting us with trips and visits, attending our mock interview day, providing job profiles and words of wisdom for our students as well as donations of equipment for the school.
