Jimmy Mizen Cup

Margaret and Barry Mizen came to talk to year 10 and year 11 about their son Jimmy and his story. You may recall that this was in the newspapers back in 2008 as Jimmy was sadly murdered just days before he was to start his GCSE's and a day after he turned 16. His parents set up the Mizen Foundation in his name and deliver Talks for change so that young people are spoken to about issues of anger and violence, turning this tragic event into something positive; building peaceful communities so that young people can realise their potential.

To celebrate his legacy and raise money for the foundation, year 10 took on year 11 in now what is known as The Jimmy Mizen Cup! Year 8 took on year 9 in the Junior Jimmy on Wednesday afternoon. It was a fantastic event! Year 11 triumphed over the year 10 in what was a fair and good spirited event, and year 9 edged year 8 on the day too. Year 10 have already pencilled in a re-match!

Plan a trip to your local library.
Reading does not have to cost anything.
There are 14 libraries in North Lincolnshire alone.

Getting your child a library card can get them excited about books. Do not worry about reading every book, library trips should be fun! At first, these visits may simply consist of spending time wandering the rows of books and meeting librarians. Libraries are a fantastic resource for free books but offer so much more such as the Borrow Box app which offers free access to many e-books, digital magazines, and free to download audiobooks, and library events to encourage children (and adults!) to read more.
