We spoke to Army Medic Jess, and her parents about what it was like when she decided that she wanted to join the British Army.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q What happens after you apply?

A Once you've registered your interest to join, you will be asked for details including your nationality and age. This will tell you what type of job you can apply for (or if you can't join). You'll then need to apply online, which will get you started on your Army journey.

After you've submitted your application, you'll follow the steps for your chosen path, Regular Soldier or Officer, or Army Reserve Soldier or Officer.



How do you prepare for Assessment Centre?

Everyone joining the Army will need to attend an assessment to see if the Army is right for them.

Giving yourself the best chance of passing starts before you arrive, and is more than brushing up on your Army knowledge and working on your fitness.
