Ollie's Special Challenge in Memory of Laila

We wanted to share an inspiring story about one of our students, Ollie, who recently completed a heartfelt challenge in memory of his friend Laila.

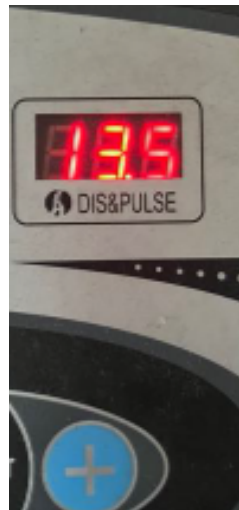
Ollie and Laila had been close friends ever since they first met in Nursery, forming a bond that only grew stronger over the years. Tragically, Laila passed away after a courageous battle with Osteosarcoma, a rare form of cancer. Her kindness, bravery, and vibrant spirit touched everyone who knew her.

To honor Laila's memory, Ollie took on an incredible challenge to run, walk, and cycle the equivalent distance from Scunthorpe to Tower Bridge in London—and beyond. London held a special place in Laila's heart, as she loved visiting the city for shopping trips, and Ollie wanted his journey to reflect that connection.

We are delighted to share that Ollie successfully completed his challenge and has raised an amazing £1,800! Of this total, £400 will be used to install a special bench in the memory garden at St Bede's, ensuring that Laila will always be remembered within the school community. The remaining funds will be donated to PACT (Parents' Association of Children with Tumours and Leukaemia), a charity that supports children with cancer and their families.

Ollie's determination and dedication to honoring his friend are truly inspiring, and we are so proud of him for this incredible achievement.

Thank you to everyone who supported Ollie along the way. Together, we can ensure Laila's memory lives on in our school and beyond.
